Faces of Humanity: According to gender roles in rural Uganda, women are responsible for domestic chores, including food production, cooking, cleaning, caring for the children, and fetching water. In remote areas, searching for water can require up to 17 hours a week during the dry season. These domestic responsibilities are time-consuming and often prevent girls from focusing on schoolwork and excelling in school.

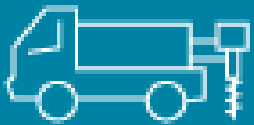

ELECTRICAL FRESH WATER PUMP WITH FILTRATION SYSTEM FOR THE VILLAGE OF LAMLESTE AND CONFIDENCE COMPLEX ACADEMY.

In Rural Ghana, The young students have to collect water from distant places, sometimes it can be a 2 - 4 kilometer walk, most of the time the water is contaminated, which can lead to severe illness and even death. Our goal is to build the sustainable water solutions in the school grounds.




The PH8 Foundation provides clean water at schools so students can spend their time learning, instead of collecting water.



Why it matters.

History has shown time and time again that education is the most effective way to move a person or community out of poverty. Dedicating laborious hours each day to fetching water instead of focusing on education keeps children stuck in the cycle of poverty.
